


There are two major international airports, one is in Samarinda, one in Balikpapan, and all of you will arrive in either of those airports.

• In Samarinda, A.P.T. Pranoto International Airport provides direct flights from major cities like Jakarta (CGK), Makassar (UPG), Surabaya (SUB), Yogyakarta (YIA), and Berau (BEJ). If you arrive in Samarinda, the Committees will pick you up at the Airport and take you to the Mulawarman University Dormitory, as long as you give fixed information about when you arrive.

• In Balikpapan, some international flights from Singapore (SIN) and Kuala Lumpur (KUL) would arrive in Balikpapan, Sepinggan Airport has more routes than Samarinda. But since Balikpapan is 2 hours drive from Samarinda, you will have to spend extra money to go to the Mulawarman University dormitory. But there's no need to worry! We are going to give you some handy tips if you want to do so.



Route from Sepinggan Airport in Balikpapan to Mulawarman University

If you arrive at Sepinggan airport, you will have to take some extra steps to get to Samarinda as we can't pick you up there. You can choose whether you would like to use **a rented car** (the committees will arrange this for you if you have requested it) or use the **'Kangaroo' shuttle bus**. The Kangaroo Shuttle Bus would have their booth at the airport. This shuttle service provides a direct route to Samarinda for around Rp200,000, so make sure you have some cash on hand.

The bus should look like this (there might be a slight difference in livery or bus type)

The shuttle will drop you off at Jalan Awang Long in Samarinda, where the committees will be there to take you to Mulawarman University Dormitory.

Please note that we can only provide information for Balikpapan or Samarinda. If you are arriving from abroad, you might need to go through immigration in Jakarta, where you will have a layover. Make sure all your travel documents are easily accessible for a smooth transition.



Handy Travel Tips

- Steer Clear of Unofficial Taxis: You'll likely be approached by taxi drivers at Sepinggan Airport. We advise against using these services as they may not speak English and we can't vouch for their reliability.
- 2. **Seek Help from Security**: If you need assistance, look for airport security officers. They are usually in uniform and can help you, although they might have limited English.
- 3. **Stay in Contact:** Let us know your travel details before you depart and after you arrive, whether by plane or bus

Modest dress is common in Indonesia, especially in East Kalimantan, due to its cultural and religious diversity. Comfortable attire is suitable for casual activities, but in traditional or formal settings, opt for clothing that covers shoulders and knees.

Manner

Indonesians value politeness and respect, especially towards elders. Here are some key tips for interactions:

• **Smile**: Smiling is highly appreciated. Whether you make eye contact or engage in conversation, a warm smile goes a long way.



- Handshakes: A typical Indonesian handshake is gentle
 and often followed by placing the hand on the chest,
 signifying respect.
- **Eye Contact**: Extended eye contact can indicate curiosity. Respond with a smile and a nod.
- Offering and Receiving with the Right Hand: Use your right hand or both hands when giving or receiving items, as using the left hand is considered impolite.

Useful Phrases

While many Indonesians understand English, learning a few phrases in Bahasa Indonesia shows respect and effort to engage with the local culture. Here are some useful phrases:

Greetings:

- Apa kabar? (How are you?)
- Permisi (Excuse me)
- Sampai jumpa (*Goodbye*)

Introductions:

- Nama saya... (My name is...)
- Saya berasal dari... (I'm come from...)
- Saya tidak bisa Bahasa Indonesia (I can't speak Indonesian)

Asking for Help:

- Tolong (Please/Help)
- Bisa bantu saya? (Can you help me?)
- Saya tidak mengerti (I don't understand)

Shopping:

- Berapa harganya? (How much does it cost?)
- Saya ingin membeli ini... (I would like to buy this...)

Directions:

- Di mana...? (Where is...?)
- Berapa lama? (How long?)
- Kanan (*Right*)
- Kiri (Left)

General Questions:

- Apa ini? (What is this?)
- Di mana kamar mandi? (Where is the bathroom?)

Polite Expressions:

- Terima kasih (*Thank you*)
- Maaf (Sorry/Excuse me)

Additional Tips - Respect for Nature
